OVERVIEW

General Supervisors for Health and Safety Services are creative, observant, problem-solving professionals with outstanding communication skills. They are passionate about maintaining the health and safety of their follow workers. They supervise testing, inspections, and formal evaluations of workplace environments, procedures, and practices, and draft written reports of their findings. They design procedures to ensure workers are protected from potential hazards and design training programs for workers on how to follow these procedures to be safe in the workplace. General Supervisors for Health and Safety Services investigate events that led to workplace injuries and formulate solutions for preventing repeated incidents. They assess factors that can contribute to safety and health issues, including lighting, equipment failures, and ventilation systems. Finally, General Supervisors for Health and Safety Services oversee first aid services at workplaces. They ensure coworkers are familiar with first aid procedures, designate employees who will administer first aid, and ensure first aid equipment and services are compatible with the specific needs of the workplace.

In doing so, they play a leading role in making sure that you and others will enter the workforce with confidence tha you will avoid hazards that can cause injuries or illnesses. In addition, workplaces that minimize accidents avoid unwanted costs that can be passed on to consumers.	Construction and building inspectors make sure that construction projects follow rules, regulations, and contract requirements. Environmental Scientists and Specialists use knowledge of science to protect both the environment and the humans who live in it. Fire inspectors conduct inspections of buildings to identify potential fire hazards and ensure they meet local, state, and federal fire regulations.	The goods and services people utilize on a daily basis, from automobiles to digital devices to the foods they eat, are often the product of highly complex production processes. General Supervisors for Health and Safety Services are needed to ensure that these processes are safe for workers who labor in all kinds of production facilities. Safe production means a higher quality of life, as it contributes to goods and services that were once unattainable becoming affordable to the average person.

TAKE ACTION

- Select a good or service you utilize on a daily basis, such as your favorite breakfast food, a digital device, or an article of clothing. For each step you identify, conduct research on potential workplace hazards and steps public policymakers and firms implement to keep them safe.

Systems to review include electricity, plumbing, ventilation, or heating and air-conditioning. Identify potential consequences if these systems were not in place.
